This component helps parents to understand how different aspects of violence are interrelated, and what they can do to decrease violence and promote peace.

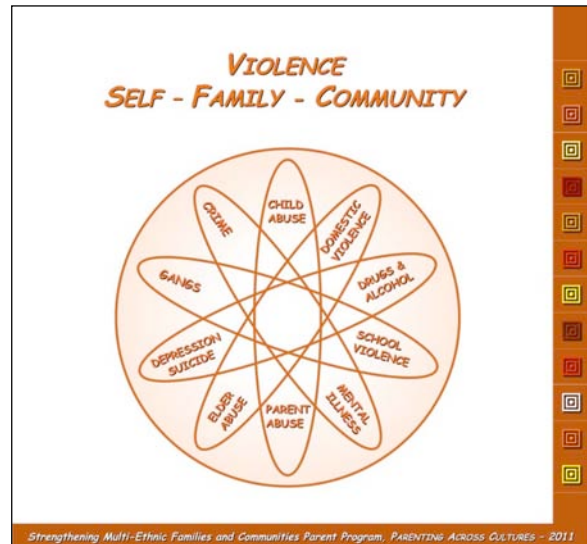
An in-depth look at different aspects of violence is presented in Session 4, and provides parents with information related to contributing factors.

Parents are encouraged to look at attitudes related to violence from a "cultural" perspective, making it easier to reflect on violence from a personal perspective.

Two Community Speaker Sessions (Session 5, Session 11) provide parents with information on specific issues, and provides facilitators and agencies the built-in flexibility to meet the specific needs of their agency and/or group.

Parents are responsible for organizing the Speaker in Session 11, and are asked to contact agencies, (Making Community Connections, Session 5), and to bring the information back to the group.

Group participants are encouraged to continue their journey (Community Action Council, Session 11) with the new skills they have acquired.
